



## International Basketball League names 2010 All Stars

### Los Angeles Lightning

- **6' 7" Trayvon Lathan**- averaged 26.3 points, 11.5 rebounds and 4.5 assists per game in 19 games played for the Los Angeles Lightning. Lathan was 'player of the week' in the IBL multiple times. Lathan could carry a team on his back for stretches and did just that in multiple series for the Los Angeles Lightning.
- **6' 5" Billy Knight**- averaged 25.3 points, 5.2 rebounds and 2.6 assists in 9 games played for L.A. Knight took control of multiple games down the stretch of the Los Angeles Lightning season.
- **6' 4" Fred Vinson**- former NBA player, averaged 18.7 points, 3.1 rebounds and 3.4 assists in 16 games played for L.A. The heart and soul of the Lightning, Vinson had another great shooting year, hitting big shots in big moments of games—all season long.
- **6' 11" Chris Ayer**- averaged 18.4 points, 9.7 rebounds in 14 games played for Los Angeles. Ayer stepped up as the dominant center for the Lightning, this year and performed well.
- **6' 7" Bryon Russell**- former NBA player, averaged 14.2 points, 3.8 rebounds and 5.1 assists for the Lightning.
- **Honorable mention:** 5' 10" Tyus Edney averaged 18.8 points, 2.8 rebounds and 10.8 assists in 5 games for the Lightning. Edney hit a game winning shot to win over the Oregon Waves in dramatic fashion, identical to his UCLA days where he hit a game winning shot over Missouri.

### Bellingham Slam

- **6' 3" Morris Anderson**- first year out of Western Washington- averaged 12.1 points, 5 rebounds and 6.2 assists.
- **6' 4" Jacob Stevenson**- a tough competitor, Stevenson put up huge numbers in 2010, averaging 25.3 points per game, 6.9 rebounds and 6.6 assists over 23 games with the Bellingham Slam.
- **6' 6" Ike Ohanson**- averaged 13.6 points, 11 rebounds in 23 games played for the Bellingham Slam.
- **6' 2" Ryan Diggs**- averaged 16.4 points, 4.5 rebounds and 5.2 assists in 19 games played for the Slam.
- **Honorable mention: Tyler Amaya**- limited by joining the team late, Amaya took a support role in 2010 but deserved HM consideration.

### British Columbia Titans

- **6' 10" Wayne Marshall**- a 6'10" center with one of the softest touches around (and he can shoot foul shots). Marshall averaged an easy 16.6 points and 5.8 rebounds over 13 games for the Titans. Marshall put up those numbers in about 22 to 26 minutes per night.
- **6' 8" Lawrence Blackledge**- averaged 18.8 points, 8.7 rebounds and 2 assists per game in 23 games played for the BC Titans. Blackledge is a quick jumper, a great defender and very fast on both ends of the court. - **6' 3" Terrence Hundley** was the BC Titans leader on and off the court. Hundley averaged 15.5 points, 4 rebounds and 2.5 assists in 23 games for the Titans. While Hundley played the shooting guard position, he also played back up point guard as well.
- **Honorable mention: 6' 3" Josh Washington**, from Texas A & M- Corpus Christi, is a deep outside shooter (NBA range) who averaged 15.6 points, 2.3 rebounds and 1.1 assist per game in 23 games played for the Titans.

### Tacoma Tide

- **6' 3" Antwan Williams**- in his second year out of college (University of Puget Sound) had another good year in the IBL. Williams is an aggressive point guard who can run a team, play defense and score as well. Williams averaged 19.6 points, 4.8 rebounds and 6.9 assists in 21 games for the Tacoma Tide.
- **6' 9" Dontay Harris**- averaged 15.1 points, 10.3 rebounds and 3.1 assists in his final year in the IBL. Harris- played his youth and high school ball in Tacoma, his college ball at Drake University, Harris played overseas and he also played in the IBL for the last six seasons as well. Harris retired this year, making the IBL All Star team—his 5<sup>th</sup> time doing so.

### Olympia Reign

- **5' 10" Point Guard Nate Menefee**- fresh out of college, Nate Menefee led the IBL in scoring with a 28.6 scoring average. He also added 4.5 assists per game and 4.6 rebounds per game. Nate was a true point guard leading his team to a division championship in their first year. - **6' 2" Virgil Matthews**- Virgil averaged 23.1 pts per game as a non starter. In the absence of Nate Menefee in two Olympia Reign games, Virgil picked up the slack and poured in 41 points and 51 points respectively. Mathews is a hard worker on both ends of the court and an above average rebounder from the guard spot averaging 7.2 rebounds per game. Mathew's season averages were 23.1 points, 7.2 rebounds and 3.4 assists in 21 games for the Olympia Reign.
- **6' 7" Nicholas Moore**- Moore is one of the smartest and most dedicated players in the league. Nichols is a great 3 point shooter, finishes well around the rim, and is a great rebounder as well. A finesse type player that can take punishment, Nicholas Moore averaged 21.9 points, 8.6 rebounds and 2.0 assists in 23 games for the Olympia Reign.
- **6' 2" Mike Ward**- is known as a defensive stopper but with good offensive skill as well. Ward plays with an extreme passion for the game. Ward averaged 19.6 points, 5.6 rebounds and 3.0 assists in 22 games for the Olympia Reign.

### Vancouver Volcanoes (4)

- **6' 1" Andre Murray**—averaged 26.6 points, 3.1 rebounds and 5.0 assists. Murray can play the 1 or the 2.
- **6' 7" Devin Uskoski**—averaged 17.8 points, 11.8 rebounds and 1.3 assists. Uskoski is a workhorse on the floor.
- **6' 0" Kevin Tyner**—averaged 11.0 points, 3.1 rebound and 5.0 assists. Tyner is a polished, precise point guard.
- **6' 6" Porter Troupe**—averaged 14.3 points, 2.4 rebounds and 3.5 assists. Troupe plays with heart, can play the 1 through 3 positions and is a fan favorite for his ability to do—just about anything needed- on the floor.
- **6' 11" Bryson McKenzie**- averaged 12.6 points, 11.5 rebounds and .6 assists. McKenzie has an NBA body and is a very strong presence inside.

### Oregon Waves

- **6' 5" Jadae Bonds**- had his best year in the IBL in 2010 where he averaged 15.9 points, 7.3 rebounds and 1.8 assists over 21 games played
- **Honorable mention: 6' 4" JS Nash**-averaged 30.6 points, 3.6 rebounds and 4.0 assists over 6 games, had arguably one of the best shots in the IBL and would have made the All-Stars if not for only being able to play in 6-games.

### Yamhill Highflyers

- **6' 9" Jason Hartford-** versatile player, 6'9", can play inside or outside; led Cornell to NCAA tourney, has developed into being a two guard which makes him an **NBA prospect** at 6' 9". Hartford averaged 23.9 points, 10.1 rebounds and 2.4 assists per game in 12 games for the Highflyers.
- **6' 6" Curtis Nash-** a 6' 5" off guard, great outside shooter, can create his own shot, from UNC-Charlotte, averaged 22.6 points, 5.7 rebounds and 3.6 assists per game in 15 games for the Highflyers. An NBA-type two guard.
- **6' 9" Durrell Nevels-** a solid double-double guy nearly every night; #15 in the league in scoring, #2 in the league in rebounding, an amazing shot blocker- overall- a great power forward, averaged 21 points, 11.6 rebounds and 1.6 assists per game in 26 games for the Highflyers. Nevels is a powerful player who should have a bright future overseas.
- **6' 0" Nate Bowie-** a NBA type 'scoring point guard', who can pass well and who can run an offense. Bowie averaged 23.8 points per game 4.7 rebounds and 6.6 assists per game in 25 games for the Highflyers. IBL Commissioner—Bowie averaged this amount of points "without ever ball-hogging or looking to score first—a true **NBA prospect**.
- **Honorable mention: 6' 6" Cheyenne Moore-** from Clemson and George Washington- a gifted athlete with a 'smooth as silk' delivery, averaged 23 points, 5.1 rebounds and 2.1 assists per game in seemingly effortless fashion; however, the phrase 'seemingly effortless' can be a put down and a compliment at the same time- as almost everyone who saw Cheyenne Moore play basketball- wondered where he could go- with more effort. Moore has big time potential.
- **Honorable mention: 6' 3" Josh Tarver-** a point guard out of low scoring Oregon State University, Tarver took about 6 games to adjust to the scoring demands and creativity needed in a professional level league. Tarver directed the Highflyers offense very well, Tarver broke down defenders and Tarver played great defense. Tarver picked up in the scoring department in the second half of the season and finished well, averaging 15.5 points, 4.5 rebounds and 5.7 assists per game in 19 games played with the Yamhill Highflyers. The Yamhill Highflyers won their first two playoff games in part to Tarver's pushing the ball at defenders and over time, wearing those defenders down.

### Central Oregon Hotshots

- **Jordan Gregg-** 21 years old, huge upside but *already* good- Gregg is tough- can play the 4 (collegiate position), he can play the 3 and in fact, Gregg can play the 2 guard position. IBL Commissioner- "Gregg has huge upside as he hits an extremely high % of his outside shots and at 6' 8"—this makes him one of the taller two guards in the minor leagues; at 6' 8" with that touch, he is a year of work away from being a big time player- the sky is the limit for Gregg". Jordan Gregg averaged 18.8 points per game, 8.3 rebounds and 2.1 assists per game in 20 games played for two teams.
- **Honorable mention: 6' 3" Guard Hassan Stewart-** averaged 20.5 points, 5.2 rebounds and 3.2 assists over 19 games.

### Edmonton Energy

- **6' 3" Will Funn-** Funn is a true floor general, a true point guard; Battle Creek Knights Terrance Dickens is quoted- "if you were building a champion, the first guy you would go out and get is Funn". Funn was a league leader in assists and had numerous triple doubles. Funn makes everyone around him better. Funn can steal the ball and has the ability to score when necessary. Funn averaged 13.3 points, 7.6 rebounds and 10.1 assists per game in 20 games played for the Energy.
- **6' 5" Steve Sir-** Sir had his most efficient, most productive and most consistent season in his three years playing in the IBL. Sir scored 25 points, averaged 5.2 rebounds and he had 2.6 assists per game in 20 games played. Sir was 50% from the three point line and 94% from the FT line for the season. A complete player.
- **6' 1" Rashaun Broadus:** Versatility and an all around game make Rashaun a constant threat. Lightning quick, Rashaun's game has matured year by year. Broadus averaged 24.8 points, 4.2 rebounds and 3.7 assists in 20 games played for the Energy.
- **6' 8" Dave Patten:** Deceptive and diverse, Patten had a good year in the IBL averaging 15.2 points, 5.5 rebounds and 1.4 assists per game in 20 games played for the Energy. Patten's inside and outside game made him hard to guard for post players. Patten was tremendous in the open court.
- **6' 8" Skouson Harker:** Numbers do not tell the story about the impact Harker has on a team; Harker does all of the little things exceptionally well- he defends, rebounds, sets screens, and takes charges- every team loves having a player like him on their team but hates playing against him. Harker averaged 11.5 points and 5.9 rebounds in 20 games.
- **Honorable Mention- 6' 10" Lee Scruggs-** out of Georgetown University, Scruggs averaged 12.7 points and 5.6 rebounds in 19 games played this season.

### Albany Legends

- **6' 9" Jermaine Tate**- averaged 14 points, 8.7 rebounds and 1.2 assists in 12 games played for the Albany Legends. Tate was a tough competitor, always hitting the glass and always focused on winning.
- **6' 9" Gordon Klaiber**- averaged 19.5 points, 7.5 rebounds and 1.6 assists in 20 games played for the Legends. Klaiber was voted the MVP of his bracket in the tournament held in Portland Oregon in which the Legends clinched a home championship game.
- **6' 8" DeAndre Thomas**- averaged 16.6 points, 9.3 rebounds and 1.5 assists in 22 games played for the Legends. DeAndre hit a game tying lay-up in the final second of a first round playoff game sending his team into overtime where they prevailed, went on to win in the second round and eventually went on to win the IBL Championship. Thomas was big in the title/championship game where his big body and fantastic positioning was too much for the Slam to overcome.
- **6' 6" Kenny Satterfield**- averaged 19.7 points, 4.5 rebounds and 8.1 assists in 17 games played for the Legends. Satterfield dominated the game by directing his team on every possession and hitting big shot after big shot- when the clock started to run down. Satterfield was surgical in his approach and is considered, by many, to have proven out, through his tournament play to be one of the best (if not the best) true point guards in the IBL 2010 class.

### Battle Creek Knights

- **6' 8" Rece Hampton**- averaged 19.7 points, 8.1 rebounds and 1.8 assists in 27 games played for the Knights.
- **6' 6" Everett Spencer**- averaged 19.2 points, 8.2 rebounds and 5.2 assists in 22 games played for the Knights.
- **Honorable mention: 6' 3" Ryan Scott** averaged 16.6 points, 3.8 rebounds and 4 assists per game in 27 games played
- **Honorable mention: 6' 11" Brandon Hassell**- from Penn State- is a great defender, healthy, agile and able to run. Hassell averaged 10.4 points, 6.2 rebounds in 27 games (a center that played every single game) for the Knights.

### Kankakee County Soldiers

- **6' 5" Ryan Edwards**- averaged 27.9 points, 5.6 rebounds and 3.6 assists per game in 12 games played for the Kankakee County Soldiers. The Soldiers reeled off 7 straight wins with Edwards joining the team including two upset wins at Los Angeles, in one of those wins- Edwards scored 49 points.
- **6' 10" Erik Rhinehart**- averaged 22.1 points, 7.7 rebounds and 1.6 assists per game in 15 games played for Kankakee County. Rhinehart is tall and can shoot the ball well, making him very hard to defend.
- **6' 5" Stan Chismark**- averaged 14.6 points, 5.2 rebounds and 1.3 assist per game in 19 games for the Soldiers.
- **Honorable mention: 6' 7" DeMarcus Bolton**- averaged 14 points, 7 rebounds and 2 assists in 11 games.

### USA All Stars

- **6' 4" Michael Simms**- played with the USA All Stars and then went on to play for the Battle Creek Knights where his combined average (for the two teams in 20 games played) was 15.6 points, 5.3 rebounds and 1.8 assist per game. Simms went for 51 points in his first game played in the IBL (when he was playing with the USA All Stars—thus, his nod for the All Stars comes not from Battle Creek but from the USA All Stars).

### Holland Blast

- **6' 3" Julius Vines**- averaged 17.4 points, 6.3 rebounds and 2.3 assists in 16 games for the Blast
- **6' 3" Eddie Spencer**- averaged 17.2 points, 5.0 rebounds and 2.6 assists in 15 games for the Blast
- **Honorable mention: 6' 7" Larry Logan** averaged 13 points, 6.5 rebounds and 1.8 assist in 14 games for the Blast.
- **Honorable mention: 5' 11" Jeremy File** averaged 14.5 points, 4.9 rebounds and 5.6 assist in 10 games as point guard for the Holland Blast. File is a tough, well rounded player who plays to win.
